Saw It On The Internet

In this three part series, the attendees will have the opportunity to witness seasoned members of the bar portray the essential aspects of a contested custody hearing where electronic evidence is at the forefront, including the direct and cross exam of the plaintiff and expert witness. The first session will begin with a presentation about what information is available in various forms of electronic devices, how to access it, and what to do about what you find (including the requirements of how to get it into evidence). The reliability of the information obtained and the value and the use of forensically sound data preservation and analysis will be discussed. A discussion of the ethical considerations involved will conclude this session.

The following sessions will feature a mock trial for the first hour after which the audience will have the opportunity to provide input about what they found effective and not so effective. In addition the panel will explain why they approached the matter as they did. We are fortunate enough to have members of the bench preside over each day's trial and they too will offer their insight into what "works and doesn't work."

The following challenging fact pattern has been created:

- The parties are in the midst of a hotly contested custody battle.
- At the present time they are cohabitating under one roof.
- Wife tells her attorney that she has gained access to husband's private email/facebook account on the household computer.
- She tells the attorney that her husband has been engaging in online sex with what appears to be a minor.
- She then said that she accessed her husband's password protected cell phone and found what appears to be nude pictures of her husband with children and her husband's text messages trying to set up a drug buy.
- Wife brings her information to her attorney to use.
- The veracity of wife's allegations will be explored in each mock trial session.
